



Innovation Seed Fund – Call and Guidelines 2027

Purpose

To pump-prime innovative research into the causes, treatment and diagnosis of hearing loss, tinnitus and other hearing-related conditions.

Through the Innovation Seed Fund, we want to support novel research ideas that, if effective, will lead to successful applications for further funding. The aim is to make these new research ideas more competitive and able to secure follow-on funding.

The scheme will also support small-scale translational research projects, such as proof-of-concept studies or pre-clinical validation studies, again with the aim of making novel approaches more competitive for further funding. (Translational research is defined here as research that seeks to advance and apply discoveries from basic research through preclinical studies towards clinical trials.) Development of drugs, diagnostics and devices are welcomed.

All proposals should be able to demonstrate how they will contribute to ultimately bringing benefit to people with hearing loss, tinnitus or other hearing-related conditions. They should be highly novel and/or innovative – potentially risky ideas are welcome.

Summary of the Innovation Seed Fund

- **Deadline:** Wednesday 4th November 2026 (17:00 GMT)
- **Value:** up to £10,000
- **Duration:** usually up to 1 year
- **Eligibility:** Researchers can be based at a university, research institute or SME anywhere in the world.

We will not consider applications:

- to support the costs towards a degree, e.g. tuition fees or maintenance
- for social research projects

Application and selection procedure

Applications must be submitted through our [online grants management system](#) before the deadline.

You may only submit one application as primary applicant, though you can be listed as a collaborator on other applications in the funding round.

Please note that your application will have to be approved by an authorised representative from your institution before you can submit it – ensure you allow enough time for this before the deadline.

Projects will be assessed by our Innovation Seed Fund Review Panel (see website for panel membership). Each application will be assessed by three members of the panel, and their recommendations will guide RNID in selecting projects to fund.

We expect to inform applicants of funding decisions within 3 months of the submission deadline.
